Brightland School has taken initiative to pull out the talent of the students in various areas through clubs. These clubs will cover an entire month dedicated to induce and enhance particular skills in them. Here is a small description about the clubs that we will be having in this academic session -2013-14.

Brightland Clubs

As you all are aware that various clubs activities, competitions and celebrations are an integral part of Brightland School curriculam which contribute to the prime motive of education i.e.an all round development of the children. So in this academic session 2014-15 also these clubs performed their assigned activities month wise efficiently which are as follows:-

Yoga Club:

In April Yoga club, under the guidance of Ms Priyanka and Ms Azra taught all the children various techniques of Yoga Asans. The children on the sprawling play ground of the school practiced Anulom, Wilom, Kapal Bhati, Surya Namaskar, Usht Asan etc which were very well demonstrated by Ms Priyanka with appropriate drum beats.

The Dramatics Club

The dramatics club had its meeting on every Saturday in the month of July under the guidance of Ms Noopur Tripathi and Mr.Vivekanand.

The children were explained various aspects of acting, voice modulation, showing emotions through body language, positioning themselves on stage, dialogue delivery and having a clear diction etc.

The teachers demonstrated the example of good acting on different situations and then suggested various situations to the children who displayed their caliber and learned from their teachers wherever it required. The children enjoyed these sessions a lot.

Literary Club

Literary club or wordsworth club conducted its activities on every Saturday in the month of August .The children were divided in three groups class wise. Classes I to III were put in group A under the guidance of Mrs Anjali Singh. Class IV and V were in the group B under the guidance of Ms Namita Srivastava, and class VI,VII,VIII i.e group C was guided by Ms Bina Siddiqui.

In group A children did a variety of activities like filling different colours in flower petals showing different noun categories .Newspaper Activity was conducted for class III in which they sorted out Nouns, pronouns and adjectives from certain news items, formed opposites and learned how to use a dictionary.

Group B discussed idioms and phrases of daily use, components and development of an essay and tenses etc.

Group C learned how to form nouns from verbs and adjectives and the norms to be taken care of while participating in a debate; how to express positive and negative points in a debate and reach the conclusion.

The knowledge of the children enhanced greatly during these club activities.

Young inventors club or Science Club

The inquisitive minds of the students got opportunity to satiate their curiosity on every Saturday in the month of September during the activities of science club or young inventors club.

Science club activities were conducted in two groups . First group included students from classes I to IV. Ms Azra Khan demonstrated experiments related to Homogeneous -Heterogeneous solutions and emulsions .Second group included students of classes V to VIII. Activities were taken up by Ms Sanchika Bajpai. The students learned to test acidity or basicity of a solution using litmus paper as indicator. They themselves conducted the test and observed the result .The students also learned how to practically test the properties of magnets. The children took great interest in experiments and thereby learning the facts by themselves.



Dussehra Celebratio




